12 Responsible Supply Chain Management

Brytec has published a separate **Brytec Supplier Code of Conduct**, which defines the **minimum requirements for suppliers**. This describes Brytec's expectations of its **business partners within the supply chain.**

12.1 Responsible Sourcing of Raw Materials

Brytec is committed to **not using raw materials** in its products that originate from **high-risk or conflict-affected areas** and may therefore be associated with:

- Human rights violations, ,
- Corruption,
- Financing of armed groups,
- Terrorism or other comparable illegal activities.

Where applicable to the **Brytec Group**, procedures have been established to **avoid the** use of conflict minerals.

Brytec companies and their suppliers are required to follow an **appropriate corporate policy** and conduct **careful due diligence** on the origin and supply chain of the following materials:

- Tantalum, tin, tungsten, and gold (so-called 3TG minerals), and
- Other critical mineral resources.

These checks are intended to ensure that the materials are sourced in **accordance with** the OECD Guidelines for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas or a comparable due diligence framework.

12.2 REACH and RoHS Compliance

Brytec ensures compliance with **REACH and RoHS regulations**, as well as **all other applicable product-specific legal requirements**.

12.3 Use of Original Parts

Brytec uses **only original parts** for its products and services.

To prevent counterfeiting, Brytec maintains effective methods and processes to minimize the risk of introducing counterfeit components or materials into its products.

Brytec invests significant resources to ensure that **no counterfeit parts**—whether directly or indirectly—are sourced through its supply chain.

Brytec expects its suppliers to take appropriate measures to ensure compliance with these requirements.
